By bridging divides, the event emphasizes solutions that utilize expertise from high-income regions to address the unmet needs of LMICs.

The "Equity in Action: Driving Progress in Cancer Care" conference unites political leaders, healthcare experts, patient advocates, industry representatives, and researchers, driven by a shared vision of achieving equity in cancer care. This event provides a platform to address these disparities through meaningful dialogue, innovative solutions, and sustainable partnerships.
